Reading: The main goals of reading are to read fluently and comprehend what has been read, to be able to discuss what has been read in detail, and to enjoy reading. These will be our ongoing, year-long goals. We will discuss various aspects of stories, answer questions, compare literature, and make connections from the literature to ourselves and to the world. (Numbers in parentheses refer to the state standard the goal is referencing.)

This week's story: We will be reading from our novel: <u>The Kid in the Red Jacket</u> and incorporating the skills listed below into our lessons. We will also be reviewing skills necessary to be successful with part 1 of the ISTEP+ test.

Read 'Article of the Day' and write 1 newly learned fact or detail, 1 unknown or confusing word, & 1 interesting word from the article (digital version to be read on student devices). Complete 'Readworks' passages and questions online.
